Riverfest is an annual fundraising event held by the Lewis County Chamber of Commerce and typically is sponsored by local businesses. Participants paddle a section of the Black River and participate in a trivia contest on their way. Questions provided by Lewis County Soil & Water are on large pool floats that are positioned along the river. There is food available at the mid-point and if needed a shuttle is available in the morning so paddlers have their vehicles waiting for them at the end.

Due to the ongoing regulations in place to combat COVID 19 we are asking that people sign up for specific start times to reduce the number of paddlers at registration as well as the number of people utilizing the shuttle at a time Start times are 8am, 9am, 10am.

IF YOU CHOOSE TO START AT THE BEGINNING AND ARE NOT AT THE MID-POINT BY 11:30 YOU WILL NEED TO DEPART THERE AT THAT TIME


